The purpose of this curriculum is to equip children's ministers, teachers, and ministry volunteers to teach kids the foundational truths of God's Word in a fun kid friendly way. Isaiah 54:13 says that all your children will be taught of the Lord and great will be their peace. We believe that this curriculum will help you teach the children the Word of God, so they will have great peace! This should also give teachers and volunteers scriptural studies and creative ideas to administer the key points of each lesson. It will begin with units designed to give kids a working foundation of Christianity starting with who God is, who Jesus is, and who the Holy Spirit is as part of the trinity. As units and lessons progress, students will also learn about Christian basics such as prayer and faith. This curriculum will conclude with lessons about everyday issues concerning right living, such as managing emotions and maturity through Discipleship. Each lesson will challenge the student to use what they have learned to continue a relationship with God through His Word.

Each section of the curriculum is designed to address and support the key point, pointing kids to biblical truths. Compass Curriculum is a Spirit-filled curriculum which emphasizes the gifts and moves of the Holy Spirit in addition to what happened to and for believers in the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus. It is our hope that in addition to the curriculum the users are free to be led by the Holy Spirit in creativity and speech, so that students can grasp a full understanding of God and His Word.

EACH UNIT AND LESSON WILL CONTAIN THE FOLLOWING:

Unit:

This is the title of the unit. Each unit will cover a specific topic and will last either four or eight weeks.

Lesson:

This is the name of the current lesson.

Unit Verse:

This is the main verse for the unit. This verse will encompass the theme of the unit. The Bible version will be in parentheses after the verse. By the end of the unit, the kids should know this verse well.

Key Point:

This is the main point of the current lesson. This should be the main thing the kids remember after the lesson.

Memory Verse:

This is the main Bible verse for the current lesson. This verse will be used to emphasize the bible story and the key point.

Bible Story:

This is the main story in the Bible that will be used in the lesson. Each Bible story will help illustrate the key point.

Scriptures to Study:

These are the scriptures that support the lesson's key points and Bible story. They are also the six scriptures that the students will study in the corresponding GPS Devotional.

Discussion:

This gives the direction and information of the lesson. The discussion tells the speaker what aspect of the topic will be covered and the corresponding scriptural information, all of which will support the key point. This discussion can be read and studied prior to teaching the lesson and/or read as a part of the lesson with the students to be discussed with them. The discussion should be used in tandem with the Bible story

and object lesson to aim the kids to the key point. Add personal stories to the discussion to help further illustrate the points.

Object Lesson:

This is a visual aid that helps illustrate the key point.

Activity Page:

This is a coloring or activity page primarily created for younger students ages 4-7 years old. It is designed to give students something visual corresponding to the lesson that they can color and be creative with.

Confession:

This gives kids the opportunity to make a daily confession of faith concerning the lesson that they have learned.

Prayer:

This is a short prayer that the kids can say each day to help them believe God for what they have learned in the lesson.

Challenge:

This is a challenge or directive designed to give the kids something they can actively do during the week that will help them put what they learned into action.

Review Questions:

These are questions designed to engage the kids in remembering the most important aspects of the lesson. Typically there will be five questions and answers, and five fill in the blank. Occasionally these numbers may be different.

GPS Devotional:

This is a devotional that has a two fold purpose. It can be copied to be handed out at the beginning of the lesson for the children to take notes and answer the review questions during and after the lesson. It also contains the unit verse, memory verse, and daily scriptures for the kids to take home to study throughout the week to reinforce what they've been taught.

Challenge:

This week, think about the many ways God has been good to you. Then tell someone about the goodness of God or how God has been good to you.

Bible Story:

Genesis 1 - God is good and everything He creates is good. He creates good things for us.

Scriptures to Study:

Psalm 34, Psalm 31, Psalm 145, Jeremiah 29, James 1, Psalm 86

Discussion:

Have you ever had someone tell you about something they ate? This person describes the experience so well that you actually felt like you were eating it. But no matter how well they described it, you never really knew how good it was because you did not experience it yourself. But once you tasted it, didn't you want to tell people about it? Didn't you want others to know what you'd experienced? The same is true with the things of God. People can describe the goodness of God; they can talk all about how good God has been to them personally. But until you become familiar with God's goodness, you'll never really know how good He is. Once you encounter the goodness of God, you should want to tell everyone all about it! And God wants to show you His goodness. Psalm 31 says that God shows His goodness to those who fear Him and put their trust in Him, and Jeremiah 29 says that He has good things planned for us. God is good all the time, and there is never a time where He isn't good. The reason that we don't always see His goodness is that we are not trusting Him. But if we will trust in God, we can be sure that He will show His goodness to us!

Object Lesson:

Show the kids a variety of foods, including some that the kids may not have eaten before or heard of, but also foods that appeal to a wide variety of kids. You can only know how good something is once you have tasted it. Choose a few children to taste the various foods. After each child has tasted the food, let them describe it. Ask the children questions about their experience, the main question being "is it good?"

Activity:

Coloring page (Ice-cream)





LESSON NINE: JESUS IS IMMANUEL

Bible Story:

Luke 2 - The birth of Jesus

Scriptures to Study:

Luke 1, Luke 2, Matthew 1:18-24, Matthew 2, Isaiah 9:1-7, John 1:1-16

Discussion:

Jesus is Immanuel. Immanuel means "God with us." John 3:16 says that God sent His only begotten Son to be with us and to be our Savior. Around the time that Jesus was born, the Jewish people had been waiting for their saviour for over 400 years. Jesus was this long awaited Messiah, but the people didn't know it. They were expecting Him to come in an elaborate package. They were expecting him to be born in a palace somewhere. Instead, Jesus came as a simple package, born to a virgin in a stable and placed in a manger. God came to this earth and lived with us, talked with us, and showed us how we were to live. Then He died on the cross so that we could be saved. Saved from the penalty of our sins. Saved from eternity away from God. Saved from everlasting torment. God sent His only son to be the saviour of humanity. This is what God did for all people when He came as a man to be with us. To receive this salvation, all we have to do is believe that Jesus came from Heaven, as God in the flesh, that He died on the cross, and on the third day He was raised from the dead. That is how we accept this gift. When we accept Jesus as our Lord and Saviour, His Spirit comes to live inside of us. Then God is with us eternally.

Object Lesson:

Bring out several gifts and packages. Most gifts should be large, wrapped in nice wrapping paper with ribbons and bows. Have one gift wrapped in plain brown paper without bows or ribbons. Just as this gift seems too simple to hold anything great or amazing, Jesus was sent in a package that didn't seem fitting for a Messiah. He was born in a manger in a stable, not in a palace where many people thought or expected the Messiah to be born. As we came to see, the most humble package produced the greatest gift we would ever receive.

Activity:

Coloring page (Jesus as a Gift)

Confession:

Jesus is the Son of God who was sent for the salvation of all people. Jesus is Immanuel, God with us on earth. Jesus is always with me, so I am never alone.

Prayer:

Father God, I thank you for sending Jesus as a gift to us. He is Immanuel, God with us. Help me to remember that I am never alone for You are always with me. In Jesus' name, amen.



LESSON TWENTY: THE HOLY SPIRIT IS POWER

Bible Story:

Acts 3 - After being filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter was emboldened to preach the Gospel to all of those around, and when he preached, 3000 people were born again.

Scriptures to Study:

Acts 2:1-13, Acts 3, Acts 9:20-31, Luke 4:14-19, 2 Corinthians 1-12, Acts 1:4-8

Discussion:

Acts 1:8 says that when the Holy Spirit comes upon us we will receive power. The word that is translated "power" is Greek word dynamis (pronounced dunamis). This is the same word that we get the word dynamite from. And as you know, dynamite is explosive! So when the Holy Spirit comes upon us, we receive explosive power. What does this power do for us? Well, according to our scripture, it gives us the boldness to preach the Gospel. It gives us the ability to be a witness, telling people about Jesus. After Jesus was raised from the dead, he met with His disciples several times over a 40 day period. Then one of the last things He told them was that the Holy Spirit would come, and that when the Holy Spirit came upon them they would receive power. Well, before the Holy Spirit came upon them, the disciples were scared and in hiding. Peter had denied Jesus when he was about to be crucified, and was ashamed. But, after receiving the Holy Spirit he immediately began preaching the Gospel with boldness. He had gone from being ashamed to telling anyone that would listen about Jesus. In fact, the first time that he shared the message of salvation, 3000 people were born again. The Holy Spirit gives supernatural power to our words so we can lead others to Jesus. In Acts 1, the bible says that this power will help us be witnesses in our city (Jerusalem), our region (Judea), our nation (Samaria), and throughout the earth. The purpose of a flashlight is to shine and bring light to dark situations. When we are born again, this is our purpose as well. God desires that we

shine and bring light to this dark world. Well, the Holy Spirit is like the batteries in the flashlight. The batteries give the flashlight the power to do what it was made to do. Without the batteries, it will never be useful in what it was created to do. You could use it for other things. You can use it as a paperweight, or as a door stop, but it will never shine. In the same way, unless you are filled with the Holy Spirit, you will never bring light to the darkness. But when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, you can shine bright!

Object Lesson:

This is a messy one! Get a 2 liter diet cola and a pack of mentos. (Make sure you have the original mentos, not the fruit flavored mentos, and diet cola, not regular cola). Open the 2 liter bottle and put it on a chair or stool. Make sure that you have a tarp or plastic spread out under the chair to catch spillage. You can also place the chair/stool in a plastic kiddie pool if you have one available. Tell the kids that we are like the diet cola, and the Holy Spirit is like the mentos. The Holy Spirit gives us explosive power! Then drop 2-3 mentos in the bottle and watch out! Soda will then explode up out of the bottle, causing a cola fountain to occur. When the Holy Spirit comes upon us, we can no longer contain what is on the inside of us. It will come exploding out!

Activity:



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

LESSON FORTY-SIX: FOLLOW ME

Bible Story:

Matthew 4:18-22, Mark 4:18-22, John 1:35-51 - Jesus calling His disciples

Scriptures to Study:

Matthew 4:18-25, Matthew 9:9-13, Mark 1:16-20, Mark 2:13-17, Luke 5:27-32, John 1:35-51

Discussion:

"Follow Me." This was one of the very first things that Jesus commanded his disciples to do was to follow Him. But what does that mean? When you follow someone, you go where they go, and you let them lead you. When Jesus said "follow me" He meant for His disciples to go wherever He went. He meant that they should let Him lead them. Up until this point in their lives, Peter, Andrew, James, and John were fishermen. They made their livings catching and selling fish. Jesus told them that following Him meant that they wouldn't be doing what they had always done. They would have to give up everything they knew. They would have to give up their identities to follow Jesus. But Jesus would give them a new purpose. Their new purpose would be to be fishers of men. They would catch people for the kingdom of God. And they wouldn't have to figure it out for themselves. Jesus would show them how to fish for men. It's good to know that we don't have to make things happen, but Jesus said "I will make you fishers of men." When we follow Jesus. He shows us in His Word and through the help of the Holy Spirit how to fish for men. In Matthew 4:18-25 we see two different types of people. People who were specifically called by Jesus and people who just decided to follow Jesus as he taught, healed, and travelled around, preaching the good news. Sometimes, you may feel like you have a specific call from Jesus. Or, you may not know what God called you to do specifically. But regardless of if you feel a specific call or not, God desires that you follow Jesus. And Jesus doesn't just want people to follow Him to observe. He wants followers who will learn do what He did, learn to fish for men. Jesus specifically asked a few to follow Him and become fishers of men, who would in turn create more followers. This is what being a fisher of men is about. Follow Jesus. Do what He did, copy Him and become what He wants you to be.

Object Lesson:

Bring out a fishing pole and various types of bait (live worms, fake worms, etc.) Talk about how when you learn to fish, someone has to teach you to hold the rod, bait the hook, cast the fishing line, and reel in a catch. Also, how different bait is used for different fish. When we follow Jesus, He teaches us how to fish for people. He teaches us what bait (words) to use for each person we talk to about Him.

Activity:

Coloring Page (Fishers of men)

Confession:

I am a follower of the Lord Jesus Christ. I practice doing what Jesus did. I practice living like Jesus lived.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, my heart's desire is to follow Jesus like I should. Help me by Your Holy Spirit to do what Jesus did and live like Jesus lived. In Jesus' name, amen.


